We exist to call and form missionary disciples. (Matthew 28:16-20)

WHAT IS A MISSIONARY DISCIPLE?

The Gospel, radiant with the glory of Christ's cross, constantly invites us to rejoice. Wherever the disciples went, "there was great joy"; even amid persecution they continued to be "filled with joy". Why should we not also enter into this great stream of joy? Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples". In virtue of [our] baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples. All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization. The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized.

Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. If we are not convinced, let us look at those first missionary disciples, who, immediately after encountering the gaze of Jesus, went forth to proclaim him joyfully: "We have found the Messiah!".

HEALING MINISTRY







FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2024

REVENUE - HIGHLIGHTS

Total revenue for 2024 was \$1,095,133.

- Collections in the amount of \$484,091 accounted for almost half of the revenue.
- Building Fund donations were \$148,559.
- Project Advance donations amounted to \$99,445.
- Other income included revenue received through rentals, interest income, sale of goods. We also received a parish enhancement grant of \$6,000 from the Archdiocese towards our evangelization efforts.



EXPENSES - HIGHLIGHTS

Total Expenses for 2024 amounted to \$870,579.

- Our parish spent \$317,313 on Ministry and Mission inclusive of the amount spent on religious education, staff development and faith formation all aligned to our vision and mission.
- Holy Grounds Renovation included: costs associated with drywalling, painting, floors, electrical work, sound system, washroom renovation; that were required to be done.
- Heating and Cooling included: work done in the Rectory and the Church.
- Building and grounds (Repairs and Maintenance) included: costs associated with the Rectory garage doors and roof replacement and installation of the security gates in the Rectory and the church.
- We are very grateful for the generous donations of labor for some of the work done which greatly reduced expenses.
- In 2024 our parish contributed \$50,548 towards elementary and high school support.

NET INCOME

In summary, Net Income for 2024 was \$224,553.

It is important that we continue to grow our contingency fund for future projects and/or unforeseen costs.

We do foresee some added expenses in the coming year related to the upkeep of our facilities and the necessity of growing our programs and services.





- 13 received Confirmation


